**THE SERVICE BODY COLLECTS  
CREDIT SUM—MERGER TONIGHT.**

The Indiana Bell Telephone Company, organized to merge all Bell system properties in the state except that in the extreme northwestern portion owned by the Chicago Telephone Company, will come into being at midnight tonight. The state public service commission received a fee of \$30,000 in connection with the sale of the Central Union Company, Frank Weller, vice president of the Indiana Bell Company, paid that sum to the commission yesterday.

was the largest ever received by the commission and was based on the \$100,000 securities issue made to bring the merger. \$24,551 was received by the company throughout 1919 under the state law, which provides for payment of 15 cents on the \$100 of new securities issued.

The property of the Southern Indiana Telephone Company, the Indiana Union Telephone Company and the United Telephone Company will be merged with the Indiana Bell Company within a few weeks.

**INDIANAPOLIS LINE  
TO BE ABSORBED**

The Indianapolis Telephone Company will be taken over by the Indiana Bell Company today, carrying out the merger contract between the Indianapolis company and the Central Union.

The state commission has authorized the issue of \$2,250,000 of 7 per cent serial notes by the Indiana Bell Company to enable the consummation of the deal.

The total purchase price for the telephone property is \$4,250,000.
