

FREE PAID PHONE DEAL

Service Body Collects
Record Sum—Merger Tonight.

The Indiana Bell Telephone Company, announced to merge all Bell system properties in the state except that in the extreme northwestern portion owned by the Chicago Telephone Company, will come into being at midnight tonight.

The state public service commission received a fee of \$50,000 in connection with the sale of the Central Union Company to the new corporation.

Frank Wampler, vice president of the Indiana Bell Company, paid that sum to the commission yesterday.

FREE LARGEST EVER RECEIVED.

was the largest fee ever received by the commission and was based on the \$100,000 securities issue made to bring the merger.

\$24,851 was received by the commission throughout 1919 under that section of the state law, which provides for payment of 15 cents on the \$100 of new securities.

INDIANAPOLIS LINE

The Indianapolis Telephone Company will be taken over by the Indiana Bell Company today, carrying out the merger contract between the Indianapolis company and the Central Union.

The state commission has authorized the issue of \$2,200,000 of 7 per cent serial notes by the Indiana Bell Company to complete the consummation of the deal.

The total purchase price for the Indianapolis telephone property is \$4,250,000.

Hints for the Hostess.

Trading in the stock on the New York exchange was suspended by the board of governors because it was alleged Allan A. Ryan, a member of the exchange, had "cornered" 80,000 of the 100,000 outstanding shares.

This action of the company in offering to purchase any outstanding stock was taken to protect owners against loss.
