

16 HURT AS CAR LEAPS TRACKS

Conductor in Motorman's Place, Didn't See Curve.

Failure of a conductor, who was acting as motorman, to know that he was approaching a curve, resulted in a Marshall street car plunging off the rails at Minnesota street and Holt road last night.

Sixteen of the twenty-four passengers were injured when the car turned over. Seven were sent to the City hospital.

John Chestnutt, 70, Kingan Official, Dead

John Chestnutt, 70, who held a high executive position with Kingan & Co. of Indianapolis, is dead at his home, 4304 Park avenue, after an illness of three weeks.
