

O. P. BACKS UP
STATE TAX LAWPlatform Advisors Stand Pat
on Goodrich Measure.

Platform suggestions made by the republican advisory committee for the guidance of the state platform committee at the convention in May contain an approval of the Goodrich tax law, and recommend that the general assembly "make such modifications that experience may demand after a fair and impartial trial."

The committee in its long list of recommendations suggested that the party be pledged in favor of the erection of a memorial building to commemorate the services of Indiana men in the war. The stand of Senators New, Watson and Lodge on the treaty of peace was commended, the committee stating that it favors some form of international understanding.

A small standing army was approved, but no action was taken on universal military training.

ASK REGISTRATION FOR WATER POWER.
The following other recommendations were made:
Legislation to utilize water power of state.

Condemnation of waste in the national government and pledging the state government to strict economy.
Rapid and material reduction of federal taxes.

Improvement of the school system with adequate finances for all institutions of learning.
Prosecution of profiteers and the gradual deflation of currency.

All possible assistance in encouraging and developing foreign trade opportunities.
Opposition to government ownership of railroads, but approval of strict government supervision of privately owned roads.

Absolute devotion to Americanism.
Favorable action on resolutions for amendments to the constitution adopted by the last general assembly.
Such compensation for officials as shall be just and adequate for the services performed.

FEDERAL SUPERVISION FOR MERCHANT MARINE.
Federal supervision for the promotion of a privately owned merchant marine.
Legislation to improve labor conditions generally.

Legislation necessary to conduct properly state, county and township roads.
Increased salaries for teachers.
Amendment of the primary law.
Improvement of the workmen's compensation law.

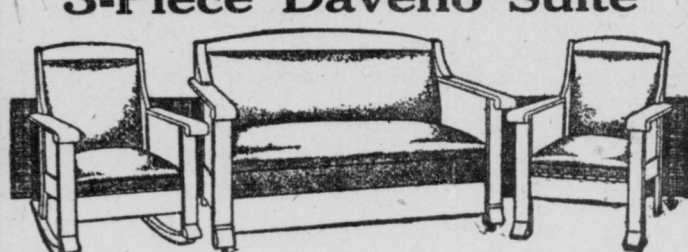

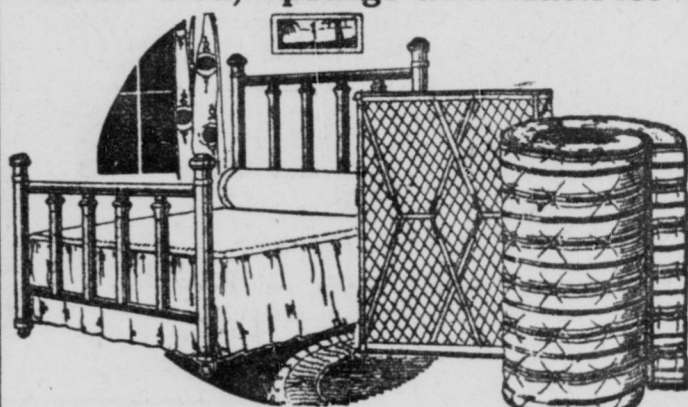
