

MOTHER, BABY BURN TO DEATH

Explosion Sets Fire to Home
in Frankfort—State News.

FRANKFORT, Ind., April 23.—Mrs. Melvin Rupe and Mary, her 3-months-old daughter, are dead here today, as the result of a fire in their home late yesterday.
Everett Rupe, 3, was perhaps fatally burned.
The Rupe home is believed to have been set on fire by the explosion of a can. Neighbors heard an explosion, and on reaching the house it was in flames. Mrs. Rupe was dead when firemen got to her, while the infant baby died at the hospital.
Melvin Rupe, the father and husband, is employed by the Cloverleaf railroad.

RUSHVILLE—Ezra Demaree of Greensburg was found guilty of conspiracy to commit burglaries by a jury late yesterday. He will go to Michigan City Monday, where he will begin a sentence of two to fourteen years.

LAFORTE—Identification of a body found in a secluded spot near Wanatah Tuesday afternoon with a bullet hole in the neck as that of Albert Leach, wanted in Toledo, O., in connection with a \$35,000 silk robbery and for shooting Sheriff Mathias during a sensational jail delivery, was established Friday morning by Sheriff Mathias.

ROCHESTER—Leo Helvy, age 9, of North Manchester, had a narrow escape from death when he became lodged in the oven of a cook stove while attempting to dry his clothing. He was severely burned.

TERRE HAUTE—A hundred families were forced to abandon their homes here today when the Wabash river reached six feet above flood stage. It is expected to go two feet higher, which will equal that of four years ago, when Tailorsville was completely inundated.

TERRE HAUTE—Robert "Toughy" Butler, candidate for republican precinct committeeman, was arrested and sent to jail charged with carrying a concealed weapon when Judge John Vox of superior court ordered every one in the courtroom searched during the trial of a contempt of court case yesterday. "Toughy" had no alibi when the court bailiff found a .38 revolver on him.

ROCHESTER—An association for the protection of the fish and natural resources in and about Lake Manitow, was formed in this city last night with more than forty charter members. The association will be known as the Lake Manitow Cottagers' Protective association.

Indiana Starts U. S. Move to Save Gas Oil

Resolutions, proposing a nation-wide movement to conserve gas oil, adopted at a conference of the state public service commission with representatives of Indiana gas plants, were mailed today to commissions in other states and utilities companies throughout the country.

The price of gas oil has risen from two and three cents a gallon to ten and twelve cents.

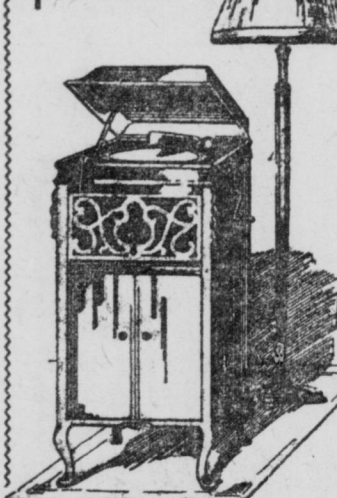
