

LONDON HEARS 35 FALL IN RED RIOTS

Disorders Reported in Former Austrian Dependency.

LONDON, April 27.—Sanguinary street fighting has occurred at Ljubljana, where communists have succeeded in seizing the city and organizing it, said a Vienna dispatch to the Express today. Thirty-five persons were killed and wounded.

A general strike has been proclaimed. Martial law has been proclaimed throughout Carinthia in anticipation of May Day disorders. Carinthia is a semi-independent duchy of the old Austria-Hungary, of which Ljubljana is the capital. Reports that a bolshevik revolution had broken out in Jugoslavia in which hundreds of persons had been killed are discredited in official circles here. The Serbian minister in London declared he didn't believe there was any truth in the dispatches of the Central News correspondent.

Locks Fail as Bar to Hardware Thieves

Locked doors and windows were no bar to burglars who entered the Moore Bros. hardware store, 2629 Shelby street, early today. The thieves broke the lock on a cellar window and then forced the locks on two doors before reaching the store-room. Five watches, four knives, twelve boxes of cutlery and a carton of cigars formed the loot of the burglars. Motor Police Finney and Lansing found the burglars had attempted to steal William Moore's automobile, but could not start the car.

INDIANA ALIENS PLAN EXODUS

A lot of foreigners in Indiana are going home. They don't like labor troubles, and complain that there are too many strikes. The high cost of living and opposition to prohibition also are given by many who apply in the federal building for passports to return to their native lands. The majority say they are going to stay, but some of the prosperous ones say they are going to bring their families back. The number of applications for income tax receipts required for passports has increased decidedly during the last ten days, according to William L. Elder, internal revenue collector. Since April, 214 applications for passports have been made. Some of these applicants wish to visit the battlefields, but most of them are foreigners.

COAL MEN FIGHT TRIAL IN INDIANA

16 in Chicago Plead Against Removal to This State.

Coal operators in other states are expected to carry to the supreme court if a decision is given for the government by the commissioner. Commissioner Mason continued the hearing until May 12.

Sixteen Illinois coal men entered pleas against removal before United States Commissioner Mason in Chicago yesterday. L. Ert Slack, special assistant to the district attorney, who aided in the presentation of evidence to the federal grand jury, which indicted 125 coal operators on conspiracy charges, said that the Indiana men will be arraigned May 6. Those who are not ordered removed will be arraigned later, he said. Mr. Slack said the coal men would
