

OCKS DECLINE UNDER NEW RAID

Strong Opening Followed by
Drive Against Leaders.

NEW YORK, April 30.—Although some stocks suffered losses at the opening today, sentiment improved after the start, when nearly all of the losses were recovered and good gains were recorded in the majority of the active issues.

Steel common, after yielding 1% to 93%, quickly recovered to 94%. Baldwin Locomotive fell 1% to 93%, and was sold up to 111 1/2 when Republic Steel, after falling 1% to 92, advanced 1 point.

Crucible Steel attracted attention, selling ex-dividend of the stock dividend issue and opening at 100, a loss of 9 1/2, following a gain of 14%.

The oil issues were in demand, Mexican Petroleum advancing 3% to 169%, Royal Dutch to 109 and Pan-American Gas 100 to 94.

General Motors, after yielding 1 point to 204, rose to 207, and Studebaker rose to 199 1/2.

Buick continued to lead the rails, advancing 1 point to 84%. Fractional gains were made in the other railroad issues.

U. S. Rubber, after dropping to 28, rose 11 1/2 to 30 1/2, and Corn Products, from 93 1/2, rose 2 points.

The market was quiet, and some reaction took place, when many issues broke through the previous closing level.

Steel common rose from 93% to 94%, and then lost all of this gain. Nearly all of the other stocks moved in the same manner. Republic Steel advanced to 93% and then falling to 92%.

Pan-American Petroleum moved up nearly 2 points to 91% and Mexican Petroleum to 169%, and were in demand, but these issues soon lost most of their gains. Studebaker, after selling up to 100%, broke to 107% and General Motors correspondingly yielded over 1 point to 208.

Reo, after moving up to 85, broke over 1 point.

American Woolen rose from 117% to 121, and then broke violently on the announcement of the increase in capital stock.

The market was dull and steady during the afternoon.

The market closed strong. Steel common sold up to 94% and Republic Steel to 93%. Baldwin Locomotive, after selling up to 113%, reacted 1 point.

Mexican Petroleum was the most active of the oil issues, selling up over 2 points to 91%.

General Motors, after advancing to 209, had a slight reaction, and then fell, after selling up to 100, reacted to 108.

Reading rose over 1 point to 84%. Buickness was in a small scale. Crucible Steel closed at 145 1/2; Mexican Petroleum at 169 1/2; U. S. Rubber, 84%; Marine preferred, 84%.

Government bonds unchanged; railway and other bonds steady.
