

U. S. STEPS IN TO CHECK MAY 1 PLOTS OF REDS

Palmer Says He Knows of
Wide-Spread Disorders
Planned by Radicals.

ROUNDUP AT CHICAGO

WASHINGTON, April 30.—The department of justice today moved to check May day disorders, which the attorney general states will be "know-nothing" but planned by extremist organizations.

Agents of the department have been widely scattered to protect industries against lawlessness and to thwart plots which the attorney general states have been made on the lives of state and federal officers.

"The government's full power will be exerted to shield public officials and citizens against lawlessness," Attorney General Palmer said.

The attorney general stated that information concerning the alleged plots and program of violence were in the hands of the department of justice in sufficient time to enable the department to throw proper safeguards about property and persons threatened.

PARISIANS LEAVE CITY BY HUNDREDS

PARIS, April 30.—Despite the impression that there will be no serious trouble in Paris on May 1, thousands of persons are leaving Paris and going to the provinces to avoid the demonstrations promised for tomorrow.

The government already is disposing of its forces to meet possible emergencies.

Particular attention will be paid to protecting railways and subways.

It is officially denied that the government is secretly bringing into the city large forces of machine guns and tanks.

There probably will be partial service on all the railways.

The railway men continued their discussion today whether to extend the strike beyond May 1.

The miners have decided to continue their strike indefinitely.

BEGIN ROUNDUP OF CHICAGO REDS

CHICAGO, April 30.—The Chicago police today began a roundup of radicals of the city, following Attorney General Palmer's warning of red demonstrations planned for May 1.

Within a few hours several hundred men known to have radical affiliations were lodged in jails.

The police acted after United States agents and State's Attorney Hoyne transmitted reports to Chief of Police Garrity that the reds intended to begin a "carnival of assassination" on May day.

OFFICIALS HERE ARE RETICENT

Federal officials in Indianapolis today refused to say whether any government or state officials in Indiana are included

among the number of persons whom Attorney General Palmer announced had been marked for death by radicals.

There are, it is said, a number of members of the communist labor party in Indianapolis, which the attorney general said had sent personal emissaries into cities to work up radical May 1 celebrations.

Mysterious posters appeared in various parts of the city today, saying "Loaf May 1, International Labor Day."

Red stickers were used in pasting the posters on billboards and telephone poles.

TAX PROTECTS ART.

PARIS, April 30.—The chamber of deputies has passed a bill prohibiting the export of works of art which the state considers form a part of the nation's artistic patrimony.




