

## DRAWS REPORT ON SCHOOL BONDS

Stansbury Rules Issues May Be Made Payable in N. Y.

Jesse Eschbach, chief examiner of the state board of accounts, was preparing a report on Indianapolis school records today following an investigation of alleged irregularities by field examiners of the board.

An opinion received by the board from the Stansbury, attorney general, approved the action of the board in making certain school bond issues payable in New York, but held that the board had no authority in law to pay a commission on bond sales as it was the duty of the board to sell the bonds.

Members of the board deny that any commission was paid to New York banking institutions for selling bonds, but admit that some issues were made payable in New York, the reason for such action being that the ultimate market for such securities was in that city.

Examiners questioned the propriety of issuing bonds for the New York market, pointing out that by making them payable at the office of the county treasurer payment of commission on the transaction and exchange on the money could have been eliminated.

The attorney general said there was no statutory place for making the bonds payable and that the board had the right to name New York.
