

**PETERS REPEATS  
STRIKE CHARGE****Again Says William G. Lee  
Was Sponsor.**

An assertion that William G. Lee, president of the Brotherhood of Railway Trainmen, encouraged the present "outlaw" strike, was reiterated today by J. Peters, president of the Indianapolis Yardmen's association.

Peters declared that Vice President Rannon of the B. of R. T. advised the men to "take the bull by the horns" in the course of a speech at brotherhood headquarters in the Saks building here last January.

Marked improvement in freight handling facilities in local railroad yards was reported by officials today.

The Big Four moved the heaviest vol-

ume of business in the last twenty-four hours of any like period since the yardmen's strike began, it was said at the office of the general superintendent.

Seventy-one trains, including 3,133 loaded cars, were moved in and out of the Indianapolis terminal of the road.

One hundred and twenty-two new switchmen have been employed by the Big Four, and other lines have hired as many men as are needed at this time, officials assert.

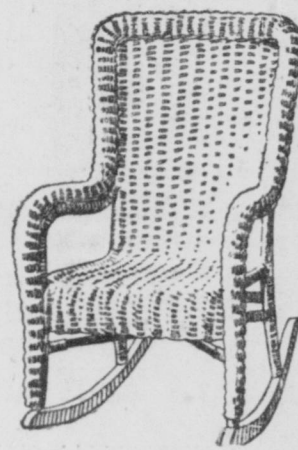
