WILCOX GETS IN LINE

The entry of two Ellingboe Specials in the rush for \$50,000 prize to be awarded winning drivers in the 500-mile race at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway, May 31, was announced today.

Making their first appearance in racing was Ellingboe, who has been driving an Ellingboe, Motor Corporation, Memphis, Tenn., will be piloted by Jules Ellingboe, of dirt track fame, and C. Glenn Howard, an Indianapolis racing product.

AMAZING SPEED ON BLOCK TEST.
