

HUNDREDS FALL IN CARRANZA'S RUNNING FIGHT

Rebels Gradually Closing in on Fugitive President, Says Vera Cruz Report.

NEPHEW AVIATOR DIES

VERA CRUZ, May 14.—Carranza forces have suffered several hundred casualties in fighting in the region of Hacienda Tamiz, state of Puebla, in the last forty-eight hours, according to reports here today.

Revolutionary leaders claimed their troops were gradually closing in on the dead president.

They expected his surrender or capture within the next two days.

The rebels claimed to have more than 15,000 men subject to their orders.

The president's force was estimated at about 6,000 troops.

British circles were worried over the fate of John B. Bodie, British consul at Vera Cruz.

Bodie was reported to have left Mexico City on the train in which the president fled.

No word has been received from him.

British subjects in Mexico have appealed to their government to send a warship to Vera Cruz, it was reported, and one of the vessels at Bermuda has been ordered to go immediately to Mexican waters.

Another report said Felipe Sanchez Carranza, a nephew of the president, shot and killed himself yesterday after he had been surrounded by rebels.

The youth was one of the best known revolutionaries in the federal army.

He was flying over rebel territory when shot down, the report said.

Rather than surrender he turned his revolver on himself.

American marines were once more on shore in Vera Cruz today. Marine and blue jackets on the American vessels here were given liberty.

Two American destroyers and one supply ship were in the harbor.

MEXICAN REBELS SEEK RECOGNITION

WASHINGTON, May 14.—The revolutionary government of Mexico was today

preparing a diplomatic drive to win recognition from this country.

Elaborate preparations will be made for a formal request for recognition if it was learned today at headquarters of Dr. Torre Diaz, confidential agent of the provisional government of Mexico."

THREE VICTIMS OF BOOZE; 1 DEAD

Two in Hospital Guarded as Wood Alcohol Suspects.

One man is dead and two are in the City hospital as a result of the police here today, of drinking wood alcohol.

The contents of the stomach of the man who died, Michael Sullivan, 547 Abbott street, were to be analyzed today.

The two men who were taken to the City hospital, Steve Toner, 328 Oldwick street, and Joseph McHugh, 648 South West street, are recovering, and both are in a drowsy condition, charged with drunkenness and vagrancy.

Late yesterday afternoon Serpt. Sandmann and a squad were sent to Michael J. Noone's poolroom and soft drink place, 518 South West street, where they

found Sullivan, who had died after being carried into the building.

Conner Robinson ordered an autopsy and said that death was caused by acute alcoholism, but that further investigation would be made to determine if the drink contained wood alcohol.

Toner and McHugh, were found by bicycle officers Cooney and Gibbons, in the rear of Myrtle Lowe's home, 828 South West street.

They had a fight, the police were told, and had been with Sullivan.

The two men were in such a condition from drink that they were sent to the City hospital.

Sullivan had visited the drug store of Dr. John M. Rhodes, 802 South street, early in the day and had complained of being ill, but later he told the physician he was feeling better.

After he left the drug store, the police believe he probably drank more of the liquor said to contain wood alcohol.

REVOLT HITS CAPITAL OF LOWER CALIFORNIA

CALEXICO, Cal., May 14.—An attack by rebel forces intent on overthrowing the Carranza government appeared at Mexicali capital of Lower California, early today, and a force of United States cavalry is patrolling the line to protect American property in the event a battle breaks out.

Reinforcements to the cavalry force are being hastened to this city today from San Diego.

Carrizo is said to have informed the American military and customs house authorities that he had been warned of assassination.

REBELS ASK ADVANCE IN TAXES ON OIL

MEXICO CITY, VIA GALVESTON, Tex., May 14.—Representatives of leading American and British oil companies have been in conference here to consider requests of revolutionary leaders that taxes on oil be paid for a certain period be paid in advance.

The amount required, they said, was about 5,000,000 pesos.

They said they were holding the request under consideration because of the uncertainty of the situation.

The representatives for the provisional government included Sanchez Azona, a senator and former minister to France, as minister of foreign affairs; Aureliano Mendiola, minister of the treasury, and Gen. Jacinto Trevino as minister of war.

Negro Politician Held on Tiger Charge

Henry Frazier, 45, negro, 515 West Fourteenth street, prominent political worker in the republican party, was arrested today on the charge of operating a blind tiger.

The arrest was made on an affidavit sworn to by Margaret Dowell, 940 West Twenty-fifth street, and Charles Robb, 965 Panzer street, is named as witness.

Frazier, after his arrest declared he did not know the Dowell woman or Robb and that he knew nothing about the charge brought against him.

Frazier is a janitor and special police officer at the county courthouse.


