

## 900 STUDENTS AT 'TECH' HIGH STAGE PAGEANT

Depict 100 Years of Local History in Five Elaborate Scenes.

### MARKS 'SUPREME DAY'

"Supreme day" was observed at the Arsenal Technical school today with a pageant in which more than 900 students participated, depicting 100 years of history, under the direction of Miss Esther P. Shover, a member of the faculty.

The pageant, in which 500 students appeared on the stage, and 400 in the chorus and band, was entitled "Our Arsenal's Gift to Indianapolis."

Throughout the entire action, which took place on the campus of the school, not a word was spoken until the end, when all former members of the cast repeated the oath of allegiance to the flag in unison.

The ringing of the arsenal bell, in the tower of the old arsenal building, marked the opening of each of five parts of the pageant.

### OPENING SCENE CALLED SPIRIT OF PAGEANT.

The first scene was entitled "The Spirit of the Pageant."

This scene opened the conflict which continued until the end of the performance, between two future citizens of the

city and the spirits of selfishness, riot, ignorance, laziness and disease.

The second scene represented the history of Indianapolis during the period before the construction of the arsenal, and showed events that made the ground available for use by the government, rather than by settlers.

In the third scene the conflict was represented showing the disturbing influences of the Civil war period.

This was followed by a scene representing the establishment of the school, including the turning of the grounds and buildings to the city, and later events in the history of the school.

### FIFTH PART DEVOTED TO SCHOOL OF FUTURE.

The fifth and final scene depicts the school of the future.

In connection with the pageant, students at the school have been studying its history and the bearing of this history on the city's future.

The old arsenal with its picturesque history with which few Indianapolis citizens are acquainted.

In May, 1891, Gov. Morton established the Indiana state arsenal on the north half of the statehouse grounds, where ammunition was made.

When the work assumed such proportions as to become a possible danger to the city, the arsenal was moved on Feb. 1, 1909, to a new one belonging to Col. Herman Sturm, superintendent of the state arsenal, lying just south of the site of the present arsenal grounds.

to take over the state arsenal and a portion of the present site was purchased in 1862 and a portion in 1863.

The purchase of the arsenal was completed during two years later.

During the Spanish-American war the buildings were used for the manufacture of war supplies.

In 1902 the government ordered the arsenal and the grounds sold, and the government flag was lowered at sunset, April 15, 1902.

In the meantime a committee of Indianapolis citizens collected \$154,000, which it turned over to the government for the buildings and ground, which according to the terms of the deed, were to be used perpetually for educational purposes.

From 1903 to 1912 the Indiana Technical Institute was operated.

In September, 1912, eight teachers and 183 pupils started the Arsenal Technical schools, which in eight years have grown to their present size with 3,069 pupils and 148 teachers, the largest high school in the city.

The Arsenal grounds and buildings were turned over to the city to hold in trust until the terms of the deed, by the supreme court, May 22, 1916.

This date since has been known as "supreme day" in the school.

During the war 233 pupils of the school entered the service of the government.
