

TELLS OF STATE FUNDS RECOVERED

Recoveries of public funds through the work of the state board of accounts have been greater the last year than the amount expended for expense of the department, according to a report made by Jesse E. Eschbach, chief examiner.

According to Mr. Eschbach's report a total of \$80,481.93 has been recovered through examinations conducted by the said examiners, which amount has been turned in to the state treasury.

The report of the board covers the period from June 1, 1919 to June 1, 1920, under the direction of Mr. Eschbach, and for the year June 1, 1919, to June 1, 1919, when Gilbert H. Hendren was chief examiner.
