MILWAUKEE, July 14.—Following the windup game with the Brewers this afternoon the Indians packed up for the jump to St. Paul, where they will stick up against the Saints in a series.

The Hoosiers are in poor shape to meet the league leaders, but, like all the other A. A. clubs, the best they can do is to hope for the best when meeting Keltner's gang.

Whitehouse was slated to get his second chance at the Brewers this afternoon. He got a terrific mauling in his previous effort here, but it was caused mainly by lack of control, and he hoped to be able to find the plate today.
