receives First Attention.

According to Dr. Herman G. Morgan, secretary of the city board of health, a campaign against tuberculosis is to be started by the board within the next few days.

The establishment of five night clinics some time ago, where patients might go and get treatment, Dr. Morgan said, was the start in this campaign.

There are between 400 and 500 deaths a year in Indianapolis caused from tuberculosis, Dr. Morgan said, which is the largest toll taken by any disease.

Nurses who will be appointed to positions with the five newly established night clinics will make a canvass of the districts and into which the city will be divided, Dr. Morgan said.

They will make a survey of the homes in which there are cases of tuberculosis and lessons in personal and home hygiene and sanitation will be given, in an effort to stop the spread of the disease.

Parents who have the sum financial means to do so, they think, can not spare the time during the day to go to a physician for proper treatment are given the opportunity to get treatment at night, and it is their duty as well as to their personal interest to do this, Dr. Morgan said.

In the present case tuberculosis can be stopped, the mortality rate for Indianapolis can be reduced to half that of the present time, according to statistics.

Dr. Morgan said the next most dreaded disease and the one that comes next to tuberculosis in deaths are the diseases of the heart and arterial system.

The disease is caused from over mental exertion with no physical exercise, Dr. Morgan said.

Plans are now under way to start a campaign against these diseases by educating the people to the importance of rest and proper exercise and the dangers of over worry.

**Heavy Pack of Peas
Reported at Muncie**

MUNCIE, Ind., July 15.—Local canning companies state that, with the canning season for peas half over, they are able to predict that the pack in this region will be one of the heaviest in history.

Canning companies are paying \$60 a ton for peas, which is the highest price ever paid here to growers under contract.

Indications point to a heavy tomato crop and an early one.

The Tubey Canning Company has contracted to pay growers \$15 a ton for this product, which is a dollar higher than was paid last year.

Three years ago, canning companies were only paying \$9 a ton for tomatoes.
