

POLICE CAPTURE STILL IN CAVE

Help Yourself, Says Gallon Jug on Stump.

Moonshine, of the Kentucky style, and a still were found in a cave on Indian creek, two miles west of Ft. Benjamin Harrison, last night by Detective George Weekler's morals squad.

Berry pickers had snuffed the moonshine and "lipped" it to the police.

The police investigated and found the entrance of the cave reached through a fissure.

In the cavern the police found a fermentation still bubbling, the "white mule" whisky dripping, but sans proprietor.

The still, 100 gallons of corn mash, 250 pounds of raisins and a large quantity of gasoline were found and placed in automobiles.

Patton admitted he owned the farm where the police had found the still, but denied he knew that the still was there.

Abraham, the police say, admitted he ran the still, and was arrested charged with being a still owner.

Patton was not arrested.
