**Ruth Now Pointed
for Homer Record
Hung Up by Werden**

**Babe Makes It Thirty-One on
Drive to Pass Mark of
Forty-Five.**

RUTH MAKES ANOTHER.

NEW YORK, July 20.—Babe Ruth hit his twenty-first run today in the fifth inning of the first game between the Yankees and White Sox. This makes his thirty-second home run for the season.

NEW YORK, July 20.—With two more home runs, Babe Ruth, the swashbuckler of the New York Yankees, made a new world's major league record yesterday when he ran his season total up to thirty-one.

Plucky Little Dutch Kerr, taking the ones that the few pitchers take these days, scored a couple for the Babe and he passed his 1919 record of twenty-nine.

Beyond all doubt the mark made yesterday is a major record of all time, but the Babe has yet to equal the mark of forty-five, made by Perry Werden of the Minneapolis Western league in 1905.

The first off Kerr yesterday made fourteen out of his thirty-one off a South paw pitcher. It also was the third homer Kerr has contributed to the Babe's record.

Penhook of the Red Sox has also dominated three to Ruth and Lefty Williams and Dauss have been hit for two.

Others who have had a hand in hammering for a lone one in the Babe are: Jones, Kerr and Bush of the Red Sox; Wilkinson and Weber of the White Sox; Wilkinson, Shocker and Hume of the Indians; and Ehmke of the Tigers; Oldham, Zachary, Carlson and Snyder of Washington; Myers of Cleveland, and Bigbee and Atwell of Boston.

Ruth's first homer Monday came in the fourth inning of the second game with one man on, and with the ninth inning without a man being on the sacks.

The first one landed in the right field bleachers. Ruth still has sixty-six games to go, and he keeps pace with the mark he set for the first eighty-eight games he will lambast near to fifty homers for the season.
