cream of the amateur talent of Michigan and Indiana and followers of the pedal pushing art will be given a real treat when these stars clash in the biggest amateur race ever staged on a Hoosier track.

Out-of-town riders are about as strong in numbers as the local boys, but they will be given a grand battle before they are permitted to carry The Times trophy out of the city.

RIDERS GET
CHOICE OF PRIZES.

With the exception of The Times trophy and the gold watch, there will be specified prizes for the various winners. The handicap men will be permitted to pick any of the eleven prizes in their division, according to the order in which they finish.

The same rule will prevail for the scratch riders. A scratch rider may win a handicap prize, as well as a time prize, if he can finish among the first twelve.

The race will start at Twenty-fourth street and Parkview boulevard at exactly 10 o'clock Sunday morning. This also will be the finishing point.

Director Wehr will be liberal with handicaps and young riders will be given every chance to capture prizes.

NATIONAL CYCLE
OFFICIAL HERE

W. T. Farwell, Jr., field representative of the United Cycle Trade Directorate of America and the National Cycling association, arrived in Indianapolis this morning to assist Charles E. Wehr in staging The Times Derby at Riverside Sunday morning.

With such a large field of star riders entered in the event, the national association is taking this opportunity to establish cycle racing on a firmer footing in Indiana and has sent Farwell here to boost the work. Farwell will act as official starter and referee at the Sunday race.

On arriving here Farwell informed Wehr that several riders from Chicago who rode in the United States Olympic trials are anxious to compete in The Times race and Wehr immediately sent

them word that their entries would be accepted if filed on the wires before 8 o'clock this evening. (The time set for closing the list.)

Otis Porter, official timer for the 500-mile races at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway, has consented to keep tabs on the derby riders with an electric timer.

Farwell stated today that the Chicago riders who have announced their intentions of coming here are among the country's best and there is a possibility of a new national record for fifteen miles being established on the Riverside park course.
