

RECRUITERS WILL HELP ENTERTAIN
Plans for G. A. R. Encampment Progress Rapidly.

Members of the United States army recruiting detachment of Indiana will be escorts of honor to the veterans of the civil war who will come to Indianapolis when the national encampment of the Grand Army of the Republic is held here Sept. 19 to 25.

The services of the recruiting detachment have been offered the executive committee in charge of general arrangements in a letter from Major W. H. Harrell, in charge of the local station.

Miss Harrell, in her letter to Wallace O. Lee, chairman of the committee on information, states that the entire detachment in the state "will regard it as a privilege" to assist in the reception and entertainment of the members of the G. A. R. "Please call upon me for any material or property which you may need and which the army can furnish," she says.

Plans for the handling of the encampment are rapidly progressing and the local organization will be completed in several days.

It is believed that at least 100,000 persons will come to Indianapolis for the encampment, and thousands of rooms will be needed in private homes.

She is the wife of Will Thornton, who will be electrocuted at Michigan City prison Nov. 12.
