

BIG DECREASE IN STATE FORESTS

Indiana Has 3 Per Cent of Supply 100 Years Ago.

HENRYVILLE, Ind., Aug. 20.—Indiana, neglectful of its opportunity to insure a permanent timber supply, should no longer delay but take immediate steps to acquire thousands of acres of waste and hilly lands to be planted to forests, was the consensus of opinion of persons from all sections of the Hoosier state in attendance today at the annual visitors' day meeting at the Clark county state forest reserve, one mile north of here.

Chairman Guthrie, who represented hardwood dealers of the state, in a dilemma over acquiring timber to keep their industries in sustained operation, declared that Indiana, with more than 22,000,000 acres of land area, had less than 10 per cent planted in timber.

"It is estimated that timber standing in the state today is less than 3 per cent of the supply existing 100 years ago when Indiana was nationally known for

the superiority of its hardwoods," he said.

He pointed out that the state of Michigan owns 1,000,000 acres of timber, 200,000 acres being in large tracts. New York state paid \$115,750,000 for 1,737,778 acres and Pennsylvania owns 1,048,996 acres now devoted to reforestation.

"Pennsylvania," he declared, "has spent \$6,200,000 toward rebuilding its forests and the last state legislature appropriated the sum of \$1,000,700 for two years in order to advance forestry interests."

HAVE TO IMPORT.

"Wood-using industries of Indiana, capitalized at \$100,000,000, and labor to the number of 70,000 and with an annual production valued at \$140,000,000, are now forced to import the bulk of their raw material from other states," he said.

Gov. Goodrich, Miss Vida Newsom, representative of the Indiana State Game Commission, H. H. Friedley, state fire marshal; Richard Lebber, director of the department of conservation having supervision of the reserve, and C. C. Dean, state forester, made short talks.

Forests and their relation to soil fertility, how forests prevent land erosion and floods, maintain water levels and the need of a permanent timber supply for

building materials and for commercial uses, were discussed from many angles by the speakers, all of whom favored and endorsed a comprehensive forestry policy that will insure Indiana permanent timber for future use.

Much of the forenoon was spent in touring the 2,000-acre reserve, C. C. Dean and Charles G. Sauer of the department personally conducting the visitors through the big woods and explaining points of interest.

On this tract acquired by the state in 1908 at a cost of \$18,000, Indiana is proceeding with the largest experiment in growing hardwoods ever conducted in the United States.




