SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

The proposed tax rates are shown in General Ordinance No. 75, 1930, now pending for adoption.

For the Indianapolis, which is in the words and figures following, to-wit:

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 75, 1930

Be it enacted by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Indianapolis, that to establish the annual rates of taxation and tax levies for the year 1930 for the city of Indianapolis, Indiana, and to authorize the Board of Commissioners to levy a separate tax levy is authorized by law, to be collected and expended in the year 1930.

INDIANAPOLIS, Indiana, and there is no other person or corporation interested in the same. The corporation is organized and carried on under the laws of the State of Indiana, and is organized and carried on for the purpose of acquiring, holding, managing, disposing of, and otherwise dealing with real estate and improvements thereon upon all real estate and improvements and all personal property of whatsoever kind and character, and for the purpose of making such investments in action of every kind and character in the city of Indianapolis, Indiana, as an association of persons may determine. The corporation was organized for the year 1920, a tax for general purposes of seventy-four cents (\$.74) on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property, and a tax levied by the city of Indianapolis for general purposes (\$.50) on each dollar for general purposes; also a tax levy of eleven cents (\$11.00) on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property for the Board of Health of said city; also a tax levy of one dollar (\$1.00) on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property for the tuberculosis fund of the Board of Health of said city; also a tax levy of five cents (\$.05) on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property for the city of Indianapolis; also a tax levied by the Board of Health of said city; also a tax

also a tax levy of two cents (\$.02) on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property for playground and recreation purposes of said Department of Public Parks of said city; also a tax levy of one cent and six mills (\$.016) on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property for the sanitary district bond fund for said city; also a tax levy of one cent and six mills (\$.016) on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property for the purpose of providing for the general expenses, known as the Sewage Disposal Maintenance Fund, for said city; also a tax levy of three cents (\$.03) on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property for the purpose of railroad track elevation of said city; also a tax levy of two cents and five mills (\$.025) on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property for the general sinking fund of said city.

SECTION 1. That the Auditor of Madison County shall collect and deposit in the treasury of said county the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property for the flood prevention fund of said city; also a tax levy of one cent on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property for the Firemen's Pension Fund of said city; also a tax levy of eight mills (0.008) on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation of such taxable property for the Policemen's Pension Fund of said city. The taxes are duly authorized by specific laws.

SECTION 2. That the Auditor of Madison County shall collect and lawfully ordered and directed to place all such tax levies upon the proper tax duplicates, and the County Treasurer shall collect the same for the County Treasurer; be and is hereby ordered and directed to collect the same for the city of Indianapolis and each of the cities of Madison County and to make due report thereof, as provided by law.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage.
