Ingredients: Two eggs, one cup of flour, a pinch of salt, two tablespoonsfuls of sugar, three tablespoonsfuls of baking powder, one cup of corn meal, one-half cup of flour and one piece of butter the size of an egg.

Method—Beat eggs very light, add water, butter and sugar. Then sift in corn meal, flour, baking powder and salt. Bake one-half hour in a moderately hot oven.


