TONE STRONG

Principal Changes to Higher Figures.

NEW YORK, Oct. 7.—Although there were variable changes in the stock market at the opening today the tone was generally strong and the important changes were to higher figures. The leading railroad issues became the most prominent features.

There was a bad break in Sears-Roebuck 7 points to 100, the issue losing 1 point to the fact that Sears-Roebuck sales have dropped off considerably in the last few months.
