

**LIFE-LONG G. O. P.
VOTER FOR COX****Dort Unwilling to Temporize
on World Pact.**

CHICAGO, Ill., Oct. 9.—J. D. Dort, president of the Dort Motor Company, of Flint, Mich., and prior to that time connected with some of the largest automobile manufacturing firms in the country, a life long Republican, has written a letter to Wilbur W. Marsh, treasurer of the Democratic national committee, stating emphatically that he would vote for the Democratic nominee because of his stand for the League of Nations.

Not only will Mr. Dort vote for Governor Cox, but he has sent a check for \$250 as a contribution to the Democratic campaign fund.

The letter of Mr. Dort to Treasurer Marsh follows:

"Enclosed please find my check for \$250 for your campaign fund. I might say that my affiliations have always been with the Republican party and except for its stand on the League of Nations covenant as set forth in its platform this year and Mr. Harding's position on this question and his declared willingness to the establishment of peace with Germany by resolution of Congress, independent of and prior to the Senate's ratification of the peace treaty, I would not think of voting otherwise than for the Republican standard bearer, but believing conclusively that America should become a party to this covenant upon same basis that would be accepted by all the other nations parties thereto, and believing that this question dominates all others either domestic or foreign, I am impelled by conscience to assist in supporting the party and voting for the nominee whose stand is clear upon that question."

**Famous Fort Vaux
Closed to Tourists**

PARIS, Oct. 9.—The famous fort of Vaux, situated north of Verdun, where a small French force held out against the Germans for five days during the Battle of Verdun in 1916, has been closed to tourists by order of the French ministry of war.

Such a step has been taken because tourists were removing various objects from the fort to be kept as souvenirs of their visit.

The latest object to disappear, and which brought about the closing down of the fort, is an electrical bulb used for lighting the inner casemates.

MILAN, Oct. 9.—The power houses and several factories here were in the hands of the workers today, following failure of employers and employees to reach an agreement on wages and working conditions.

Sixteen flour mills and sixty macaroni factories were occupied by workers at Torreannunziata and neighboring towns, according to advices from Naples.

**W. NEW YORK ST.
TO BE REPAIRED****Delayed Paving Work to Be
Taken Up Soon.**

The Indianapolis Street Railway Company will begin repair work on its tracks in West New York street, between Blake

and West streets early next week, according to an announcement of J. P. Tretton, superintendent, regarding the rerouting of car lines using this street.

This means that the paving of New York street, which has been delayed all summer by the failure of the company to repair the tracks may be completed within a short time, the contractor in charge of the street improvement having stated to the board of works some time ago

that he could finish the job as soon as the track work was done.

BASE EXPOSED TO TRAFFIC.

On the promise of the street car company to repair the tracks last spring the contractor removed the surface of the street, with the result that the concrete base has been exposed to traffic with much damage all summer long.

Mr. Tretton also announced that through service on the Garfield line will

be discontinued for a period of seven or ten days, during which time the city will repair the sewer under the Fogies Run drain on South street, between Illinois and Meridian.

PROVIDE FOR CAR SERVICE.

During this period the South East line, by the use of a crossover at Lincoln and East streets, will operate through to Garfield Park.

Patrons on the Garfield line will be

served by cars running from South and Meridian streets to Lincoln and East streets and return, and a car on the downtown side of South street will make the downtown loop.

Transfers will be issued for change from the loop to the Garfield car.

While New York street is being repaired the West Michigan and West Tenth street lines will come to the downtown district by way of Blake street and Indiana avenue.

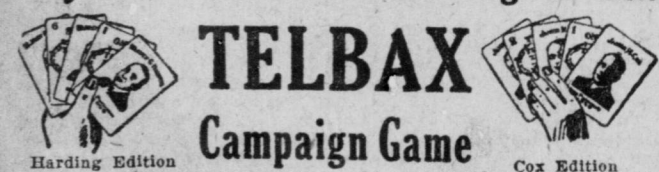
