Gossip Leads to Lively Battle
—Bullet Shatters Door.

According to the police, Walters went to the home of Cecil Jacobs, 3229 School street, asking him whether he had heard anything said as to the character of his wife, Mrs. Ethel Walters.

Before an answer had been given Dally came out of his grocery and said: "What do you want now, you're nose punched?" at which a fight started. It was reported that Dally and Walters fought only for a short while when Jacobs parted the two, after which Walters went home and returned with a small revolver, the police were told.

Walters went to the rear of the store, where Dally and his family were, and shot twice through the screen door, breaking the glass, according to the police.

According to Dally, Walters threatened to kill him and also threatened the life of his wife.

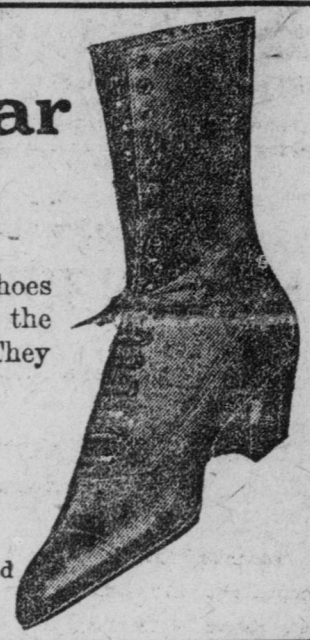
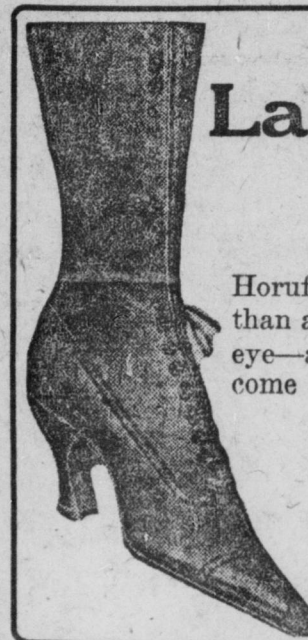
