

WOMEN TO VOTE FOR DEMOCRATS

McCulloch Says Party Does
Most for People.

LOGGOTEE, Ind., Oct. 22.—Dr. Carleton B. McCulloch, Democratic nominee for Governor, in an address here this afternoon, declared the majority of women will vote the Democratic ticket this fall because "they realize that party has its ear close to the throbbing heart of humanity and maintain always a systematic attitude."

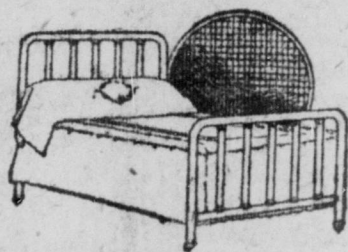

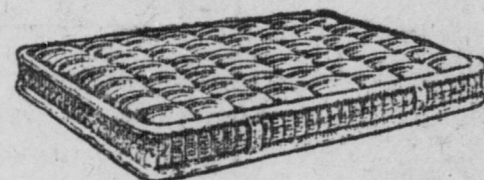
