

WOMEN TO VOTE

LOOGOOTEE, Ind., Oct. 22.—Dr. Carleton B. McCulloch, Democratic nominee for Governor, in an address here this afternoon, declared that most of the women who will vote the Democratic ticket this fall because "they realize that party has its ear close to the throbbing heart of humanity and maintain always a systematic attitude."




