Miss Bush has been Mr. McCray's secretary for the past twenty years and during the campaign served in the national headquarters of the Republican party in Chicago as executive secretary in the women's national organization. She has been prominent in club and suffrage circles in Indiana.

The Governor-elect will leave Saturday afternoon for Fowler, where a jollification is to be held tomorrow night. The celebration of Mr. McCray's election, scheduled for Saturday night in Kentland, his home town, will be held later.

Mr. McCray, in speaking of appointments, indicated that party service would

not be ignored in his selections, but he added the appointees must be capable of handling the office to which he is appointed.

TRY TO IDENTIFY AMNESIA VICTIM

Two scars, one a small one on the

back of his left hand, and the other, also small, on the upper part of his forehead, are distinguishing marks. The man said the spot on his forehead is tender to the touch.

Chief Fletcher examined Jim's clothing closely. He wore a pair of No. 10 tan shoes, but no marks on them showed where they had been purchased. The marks from the dark three-piece suits of clothes that he wore had been removed. The black and gray checked overcoat, almost new, was purchased from The Halle Bros. Company, Cleveland, Ohio. The label in that coat bore the figures "11x30" and stamped

read: "The black derby hat was purchased from W. B. Davis & Co., of Cleveland, Ohio, and cut in the sweat-band of that hat are the letters, 'J. M.' The hat is 7 1/2 in size and the duplicate number is 'D20068.'"

These facts coupled with information previously obtained by the police from papers found in the man's pocket, leads them to doubt he is Volney Davis, 1564 King street, Toronto, Canada, which was the name given him by Clarence E. Shinn, 431 North Illinois street, branch manager of the Western Oil Refining Company, who visited the amnesia victim at the hospital.

A letter signed by a man named

"Brian" suggests that Jim be his representative in England. Another part of a letter was found, but it was torn in such a way that little could be learned from it.

About one-fourth of a Canadian Army discharge was found showing that Jim (the last name and part of his number being torn off)—had enlisted at W—, but the remainder was torn off and only part of his description remained. A card with a number of names and street numbers, but no city given, also was in his pocket, as was a small camera picture of a Canadian soldier in uniform on a boat so indistinct it is of no value for identification purposes.



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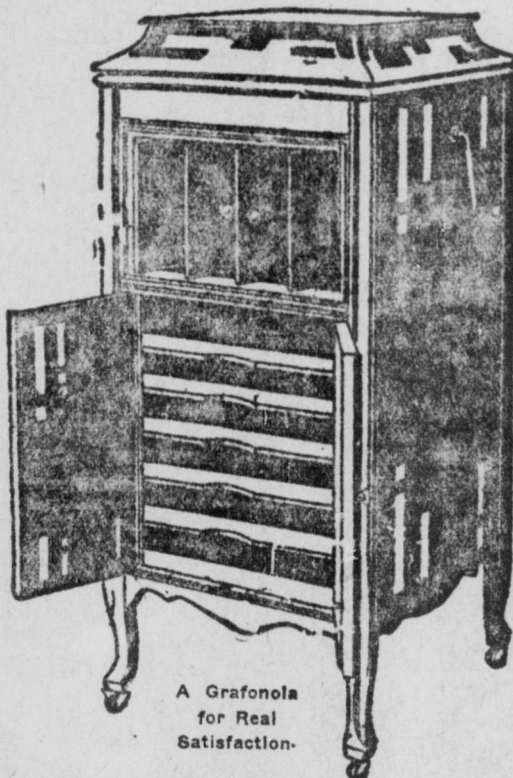
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
