

## DE PAUW HOUSING FACILITIES SHORT

President's Report Shows Need of Accommodations.

GREENCASLLE, Ind., Nov. 12.—De Pauw University officials may have to limit the number of students who enter the institution next year because of a shortage of housing accommodations here, according to reports of the president and other officers of the school for the year 1919-1920.

The report of President George R. Gross says:

"The housing condition of our students presents one of the gravest problems at the present time. Of the women students 50 live in their own homes, 129 in sorority houses, 107 in lodging houses and 231 in the two halls of residence."

"The Hall, with a capacity of sixty, in fraternity houses and private homes in town afford accommodations for the men students. The fraternity and sorority houses are overcrowded and in some instances not well suited for their purpose."

"With the sorority and fraternity houses already filled, with every room in the women's halls engaged and a waiting list of twenty-five, and with assured accommodations for only six women in private homes, with a reliable prospect of a larger number of men in attendance than ever before, under the provisions of the Rector Scholarship Foundation, I see no means at present for caring next fall for the young people who are knocking at our doors for admission."

De Pauw University now has fifteen buildings devoted to college uses. This plant, including apparatus and equipment, is conservatively appraised at \$1,060,835. The physical plant is now in better condition for work than at any time in the last eight years.

## Succeeds Coolidge

SAYS COAL EXPORT IS NOT H. C. CAUSE  
Commission Reports Seaports Were Affected Most.

NEW YORK, Nov. 12.—Coal exports for this year amount to only 8.5 per cent of the country's total production, the International Commerce Commission said in a statement today.

"While this is larger than exports for the years from 1914 to 1919, when they ranged from 5.8 per cent and 6.19 per cent of the production, it was a minor factor in bringing about 'unjustified' prices over the country as a whole, but did cause exorbitant prices at New York, Philadelphia, Baltimore, Hampton Roads and Charleston, S. C., the commission said. For the first nine months of this year the coal and bunker demands through these ports was more than one-half the coal shipped to these ports."

"The foreign demand intended the abnormal domestic demand," said the statement, "and the several factors together afforded an opportunity for the exacting of prices not justified by the cost of production. For the country as a whole the foreign demand was a minor factor, but in that part of the country the coal section which was dependent on shipments on the water lines the foreign demand was a very important factor."

This statement was asked in a Senate resolution passed June 4, 1920.


