As David Wardle planted this hope of mutual love and eternal joy in the breast of his ward, Katie, the great audience received those words as if they were a wonderful benediction. Men and women of that audience were not ashamed of their tears and offered no excuses as some allowed them to trickle down their cheeks, while others proudly, but tenderly, wiped them away. With laughter they watched Peter Grimm in the first act try to shelter Katie from the world just as one would protect a flower from winter's cold winds. They smiled at his attempt to make a match between Katie and his nephew, Frederik, without consulting the heart of Katie. They laughed out loud during a repeated moment on "spirits" between Old Peter and Dr. Andrew MacPherson and rejoiced when Peter and the grand old doctor made an agreement that if Peter should die first that he would come back in spirit.

Laughter was chased away as Peter received a promise on the Bible from Katie that she would marry Frederik and tears came into the eyes of all as the spirit of Old Peter took flight as Willem, a mere lad, came running in with circus tickets for himself and Peter.

Very quiet was the big audience in the second act when the spirit of Peter returned on the important mission of freeing Katie from her promise of marrying Frederik when her heart was beating in love time for James Hartman. The dramatic intensity of the scene, where the beloved doctor uses

That has been the divine mission of David Wardle—the mission of love, tenderness and laughter to all of us.

If you go to English's the remainder of this week you will see David Wardle at his best; the mastery of David Balaco in his best stage expression, and you will witness a cast that is as perfect as any cast could be.

Really marvelous work is done by Michael Doyle as Katie; sterling work by Joseph Brennan as the doctor. Who believes that good return sympathetic work is reflected by Marie Bates as Mrs. Bartholomew, and complete mastery of moods is reflected by John Salopoli as Frederik. The remainder of the cast does perfectly all that they are called upon to do.
