Those words uttered from the spirit lips of Peter Grimm fell like a benediction upon men and women of this world, who gathered at English's last night to witness David Warfield play upon the very heart of his audience.

Standing on the threshold of the shadow world and the real world, the spirit of Peter Grimm whispered the meaning of youth into the heart of his beloved ward, Katherine, Katie, as Peter called her when he was alive, heard him speak softly of the time when she would yield to true love and become the wife of James Hartman.

Old Peter from spirit land, bending over Katie as she clasps in her arms some of his beloved flowers, tells her how happy he will be when the patter of little feet are heard in the house which once was his and reminds her of the glorious sunset of her life, when, as a grandmother, she will look back over the yesterday, but still happy in the hope of the future.

As David Warfield planted this hope of motherhood and eternal love in the breast of his ward, Katie, the great audience received those in English's which they were a wonderful benediction. Men and women of that audience were not ashamed of their tears and offered no excuses as some allowed them to trickle down their cheeks, while others proudly, but tenderly, wiped them away. Seldom are compliments so real paid in the theater nowadays and surely David Warfield, the master, in expressing the hope that love never says good-bye, felt the wonderful response from his audience last night.

With laughter they watched Peter Grimm in the first act try to shelter Katie from the world just as one would protect a flower from winter's cold winds. They smiled at his attempt to make a match between Katie and his nephew, Frederick, without consulting the heart of Katie. They laughed out loud during a heated argument on "spirits" between Old Peter and Dr. Andrew MacPherson and rejoiced when Peter and the grand old doctor made an agreement that if Peter should die first that he would come back in spirit.

Laughter was chased away as Peter received a promise on the Bible from Katie that she would marry Frederick and tears came into the eyes of all as the spirit of Old Peter took flight as Willem, a mere lad, came running in with circus tickets for himself and Peter.

Very quiet was the big audience in the second act when the spirit of Peter returned on the important mission of freeing Katie from her promise of marrying Frederick when her heart was beating in love time for James Hartman. The dramatic intensity of the scene, where the benevolent doctor uses

The third act found the audience held in the powerful grasp of the master as his spirit caused Willem to answer the call of the clown or the circus in the clouds, and as the spirit form of the lad joined in the shadow of Old Peter, those out in front bowed their heads in submission to the charm of David Warfield.

Then joy came into the hearts of all because Old Peter had told Katie that love never says good-bye.

David Warfield is today in his golden years—years made mellow and marvelous by the memory of his years of service on the stage. Yes, years of bringing smiles to countless thousands and tears

to hearts of men and women who need the softening influence of love.

That has been the divine mission of David Warfield—the bringing of love, smiles, tears and laughter to all of us.

If you go to English's the remainder of this week you will see David Warfield at his best; the mastery of David Warfield in his best stage expression, and you will witness a cast that is as perfect as any cast could be.

Really marvelous work is done by Miriam Dore as Katie; sterling work by Joseph Brennan as the doctor who believes that the dead return; sympathetic work is accomplished by Marie Bates as Mrs. Bartholomew, and complete mastery of moods is reflected by John Salapoulos as Frederick. The remainder of the cast does perfectly all that they are called upon to do.

The big dramatic hour of the season is here.

David Warfield will conclude his engagement at English's Saturday night.

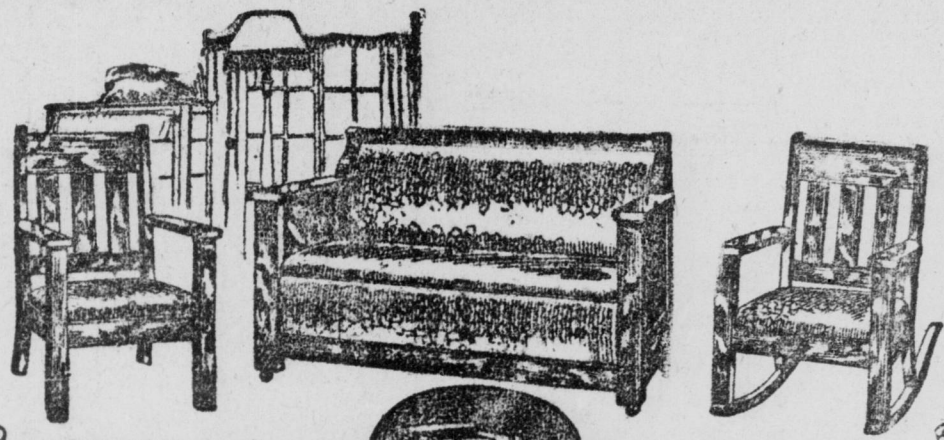

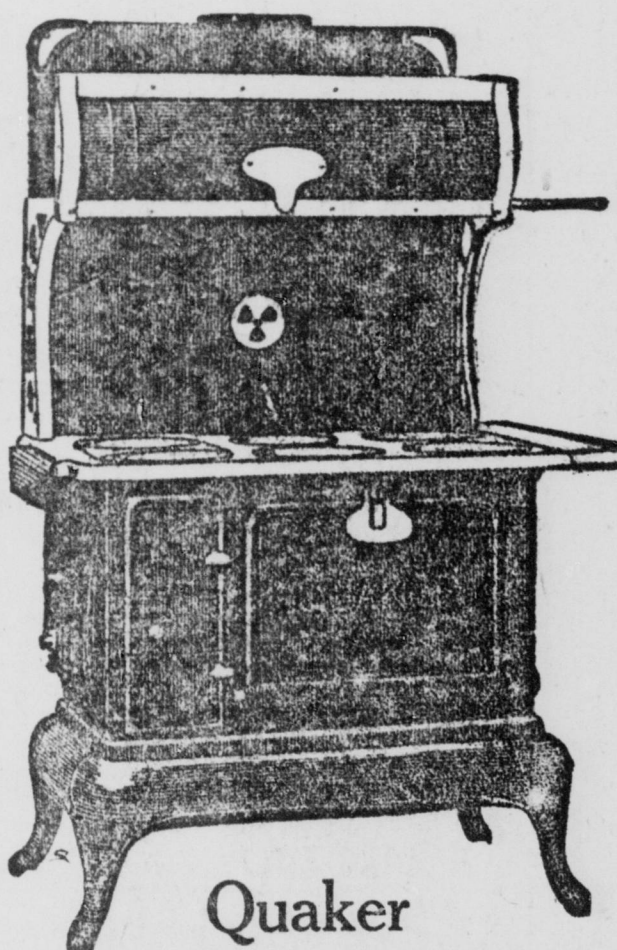

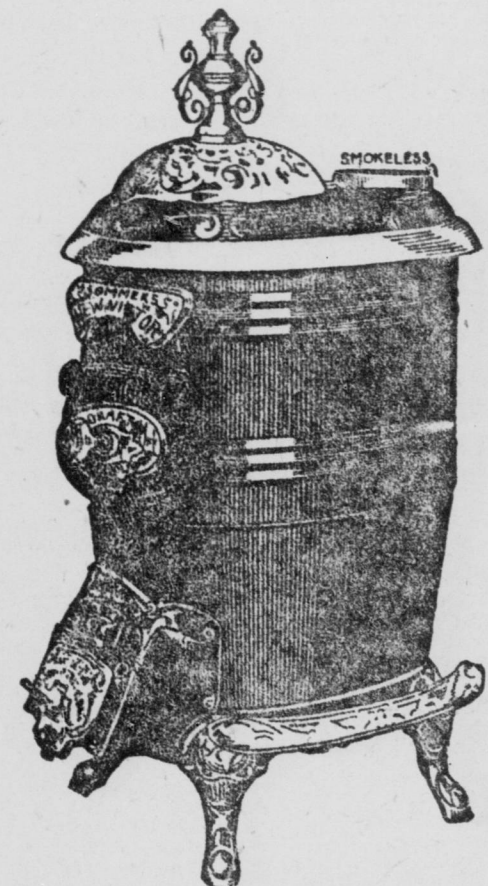
