

LEAGUE TURNS COLD SHOULDER TO ARGENTINA

Regret Expressed Over Withdrawal, but No Effort Made to Meet Demands.

GENEVA, Dec. 6.—Honorio Pueyrredon, foreign minister of Argentina and head of the Argentine delegation, gave the following statement to the representatives of the French press today:

"Under Article 26 of the covenant the withdrawal of the Argentine delegation from the assembly is equivalent to serving notice of resignation to the assembly and the French press today."

"The Argentine delegation was absent from both the assembly meeting and the meeting of the general committee of the assembly."

GENEVA, Dec. 6.—The assembly of the League of Nations today turned a cold shoulder to Argentina and made no outward efforts to retain the South American republic in the League of Nations. A note was addressed to the Argentine delegation in behalf of the assembly by President Wilson, but the Argentine delegation was withdrawing from the league under Article 26 of the covenant. The big developments of the day were:

1. Argentina's proposal for immediate admission of the Argentine nations referred to a committee which will not report until 1921.

Take Man Wanted in Juvenile Court

After a chase extending over a good part of the State, Charles Farmer, who has been wanted by the Juvenile Court of this city, was placed in the Marion County Jail last night. Don't stuff up! Quit blowing and snuffling! A dose of "Pape's Cold Compound" taken two or three times a day will break any cold up in a few
