Insane Doctor Uses Knife on Patient

BERLIN, Dec. 10.—Herr Gebhard, a surgeon with a large practice in Schwerin, the capital of Mecklenburg, has been certified insane and removed to a lunatic asylum. He had continued to operate long after his mind had given way, for he was the proprietor of a nursing home. It had been noticed that a disproportionate number of deaths occurred in the home, and during a recent operation the nurse who assisted him noticed that he went on operating after the patient, a woman, was dead. She drew his attention to the fact that death had occurred, but Dr. Gebhard calmly went on operating on the corpse.

After his removal to the asylum it was discovered that a number of unusual op-

erations had been performed by him. Among them was the case of a soldier whose arm had been unnecessarily amputated, while a woman suffering merely from inflammation of the ear had her ear removed.

MISTAKEN FOR BURGALAR. EVANSVILLE, Ind., Dec. 10.—L. C. Brewer, of West Brookton, Ala., is in a local hospital here with a bullet wound in his side inflicted by his brother, whom he was visiting and who had taken him for a burglar, after he had left the house for a while and returned by the way of the kitchen. Physicians say the man's life may be saved.
