

HOOSIERS BUY MANY SEALS

Frankfort Kiwanis Club Takes \$500 Health Bond.

Indiana has started toward a new record of support for the Christmas seal, according to announcement here today that Murray A. Auerbach, executive secretary of the Indiana Tuberculosis Association, under the auspices of which the annual Christmas seal sale is being conducted in the ninety-two counties of the State.

Unusual support has been in evidence in many counties and officials of the State association predicted today that Indiana's total for 1920 would exceed that of any previous year in the anti-tuberculosis fight. The remarkable announcement came from Frankfort, Ind., today that the Kiwanis Club there had just purchased a \$500 health bond and that the High School basketball team, one of the strongest aggregations in the State, had challenged any similar team in Indiana to play a match game, the proceeds to be used in the purchase of Christmas seals.

All day yesterday in many counties of the State the Salvation Army, under the direction of Evangeline Booth, commander, lent its powerful influence to the seal sale. In Indianapolis all the workers of the Army, under command of Brigadier Casler, conducted a telephone seal sale, and many hundreds of dollars were produced for the Marion County Tuberculosis Association.

At Indianapolis yesterday the Army, under command of Captain Hall, gave the entire proceeds of the Christmas kettle to the seal sale, and this same splendid cooperation was reported from Evansville and Lafayette.
