UNION HEADS ARE OFF TO QUIZZING

Bricklayers' Officers Leave as Voluntary Witnesses.

William J. Bowen, president of the Bricklayers', Masons' and Plasterers' International Union of America; Thomas R. Reese, first vice president, and William Dobson, secretary, will go to New York Wednesday as voluntary witnesses in the "building trust" investigation.


They will repeat their testimony to the effect that the bricklayers received several thousand dollars from the Marble Dealers' Employers' Association for "special and extraordinary counsel and advice."

Mr. Bowen said he had information that marble workers, stone setters and stone cutters in New York received \$10 a day, while contractors were charging builders \$14.50 for these men and then collecting an additional 10 per cent.

He said he had information also to the effect that contractors charged \$16.25 for the services of union men while they were being paid only \$10 a day.




