

**INCOME TAX HELD
FOR MAN'S DEATH****Canadian Millionaire Victim of
Mental Depression.**

FT. WORTH, Texas, Dec. 17.—Death of John P. Hammill, millionaire Ottawa, Ontario merchant, was due to mental depression from compiling his income taxes in accordance with the Canadian law, Mrs. Hammill, his widow, told authorities here.

According to Mrs. Hammill the exaction demanded by the Canadian law in

filling out the tax return were too severe for her husband's mind. Hammill, she said, was making the return for the Murphy-Gamble Company of which he was president. Hammill was found here several days ago on a road-side, dead from exposure. A nationwide search had been made for him.

"It was as if the earth had swallowed him when he disappeared," Mrs. Hammill told authorities, they said. "No word came from him late at night and it was then I remembered the look of worry and depression on my husband's face as he buried his face in his hands the night before."

"It was the mental effort and fear of

making a mistake in his tax report that caused his death."

Officials said she showed a telegram from her husband while he was in Ft. Worth which read:

"I am tired and weary, my days on earth are few, death is near."
