

## RETURN OF SEAL LETTERS ASKED

Purchasers' Replies Delayed by Mail Rush.

Indianapolis' citizens have been urged to return their Christmas Seal letters to the Christmas Seal headquarters, in the Pythian building, in a statement issued by the 1920 seal commission. In former years experience has shown that costly follow-up letters holding seal letters, which by inadvertence had not been returned, might be done away with if the general public were informed that the Anti-Tuberculosis Association could save much money for health work if those holding letters would return them with seal purchases prior to the Christmas postal rush. The commission's statement urged that all citizens who have not yet sent their Christmas Seal letters should make an effort to do so before next year.

A steady stream of large and small seal purchases is coming in to seal headquarters, but the number of letters being returned by the public generally less than last year. If costly follow-up letters are used, some of the funds of the Anti-Tuberculosis Association will be diverted from health work according to the statement, and officers of the tuberculosis organization hope this will not be necessary to any large degree this year.

Large contributors to the seal and health bond campaign have continued to raise the totals. The American Central Life Insurance Company, following its custom of long standing, has purchased 10,000 seals.

Pennsylvanian Lodge, No. 564, F. and A. M., acting on the advice of Dr. Clark E. Day, the new health chairman of the lodge, decided unanimously at a recent business meeting to purchase 10,000 seals, and the purchase has been made.

The Indianapolis Street Railway Company sent in a check for \$25 for a health bond of that amount.

The Mooney-Mueller-Ward Company, which always has made substantial contributions to the Anti-Tuberculosis seals for the Christmas mail. The Cole Motor Car Company, Bass, Knowlton & Graham and other companies have purchased substantial amounts of the little holiday stickers.




