NEW YORK, Dec. 22.—The investigation into the death of Mrs. Penelope Lee, widow of Dr. John A. Lee, noted specialist, whose body was found early yesterday on the beach at Long Beach, N. Y., has about ended today. The authorities were firm in the belief that the woman had committed suicide because of grief over her husband's death. It is thought she took poison. The contents of her viscera will be analyzed. Friends declared that Mrs. Lee had made repeated efforts to communicate with the spirit of her husband. Her failure to reach him is believed by her friends to have caused her to take her own life.
