**CHICAGO, March 3.**—Judge Kenesaw Mountain Landis maintained strict silence today regarding the report of the Judiciary Committee of the House of Representatives at Washington, which recommended a thorough hearing of impeachment charges against him by the next Congress.

**Landis is a method by which a Federal judge may be removed from office if he is unsatisfactory and that is by impeachment. But they will never impeach me, he said. I am not a politician. I am a jurist. I will not resign until I have been impeached.**

**WASHINGTON, March 3.**—Eastern railway officials will confer with representatives of their common and semi-skilled labor next Tuesday on the question of wage adjustments, it was learned today.
