

## LIKE WILD WEST WAS BOOZE RIDE

Local Men Find Trouble at Shelbyville.

SHELBYVILLE, Ind., March 4.—John Cameron and George Eagen, members of Indianapolis, who were arrested here Wednesday afternoon on charges of operating a motor car while under the influence of liquor and were held in the Shelby County jail under bonds of \$2,000 from city court, were released this afternoon when they provided bond.

The bond of each was reduced to \$1,000 today. William A. Green of Ripley County, father-in-law of Cameron, provided the sum for Cameron's release. An additional affidavit was filed today against Eagen in the Shelby Circuit Court, charging him with violating the motor vehicle law of the State in failing to stop his car, following an accident, and assisting the victim of the accident.

An investigation by the police today on the wild ride which was staged by Cameron and Eagen disclosed two other smash-ups which had not been reported by the car owners.

A touring car owned by George Pollard of this city and another car were each struck by a careening car driven by the Indianapolis men. Will Shelton, employee of a local hardware company, who was driving the truck which was struck by the auto driven by Cameron and Eagen, and who was thrown beneath a wheel of his truck, was somewhat improved today from the injuries he received.

## Morristown Men in Shelby Court

SHELBYVILLE, Ind., March 4.—Charges of petit larceny, contained in indictments returned during the recent session of the court, resulted in the arrest of Richard Heck, Lawrence Porter, Garnet Coppie and James Coers, all young men of the Morristown community.

Charles F. Zilke and Orville D. Sampson, poultry dealers of Morristown, were also indicted in Circuit Court on separate indictments charging them with purchasing poultry without having a

license. Mr. Zilke and Mr. Sampson entered pleas of not guilty to the charge and were released on bond of \$100 each.

The four young men, who had been committing a number of thefts during recent months, were indicted for the offense of petit larceny, charged that they had been under advisement by the court. Heck and Coers are charged with having stolen a quantity of corn belonging to Mrs. Anna Zilke, which was stolen from the same crib on her farm near Morristown.

Heck is a son of Ray Heck, who was convicted of grand larceny and perjury

in the Shelby Circuit Court and is now serving his sentence in the State prison.

Porter and Coppie were charged with stealing chickens belonging to Frank Curson, a farmer living east of Morristown. The boys are said to have sold the poultry to Zilke and Sampson, who purchased the fowls at a time when they had no dealers' license, which resulted in their arrest.


