Thirty-two high school basketball teams in Hoosierland are today testing upon them the right to appear in the sectional tournaments on slow Friday and Saturday to gain the right to compete in the regional contests at Purdue and Indiana Universities Saturday.

Franklin High School of this city gained the right to play at Bloomington Saturday after staging two remarkable contests here last Friday and Saturday, one against Valley Mills and the other against Terre Haute. The two schools were forced to the limit in both contests, winning from Valley Mills by four points and Marion by five points.

The two schools seem rosy at this time, for Coach Black's athletes face the Vincennes in the final contest of the Bloomington regional. However, the local lads will be forced to the limit in their contests, winning from Valley Mills by four points and Marion by five points.

SEVERAL TEAMS APPEAR STRONG.

Picking the winners of the games at the regional games is sure to be a hard job, although it is a foregone conclusion that Bloomington, Franklin, Martinsville, Bedford, Muncie and Central Evansville will be the main schools. Marion, although forced to the limit to beat the Smithville five in the section, is anticipated little trouble in downing the Columbus quintet in the regional. Bedford was also forced to the limit in the sectional but figures high against Russellville in the meet at Indiana "U." Franklin should have a picnic against Smithville, while Marion is sure to play to hang up a basket-ball for the Garfield team from Terre Haute. Muncie is doped as a winner over Richmond. As for the Ridgefield-Pottsville, Marion there is some doubt as to whether Central of Evansville plays Sandusky and should go through with little or no trouble.

So much for the contests at Bloomington for the honor of competing in the finals at the Coliseum, March 18 and 19.

Taking the northern part of the State of Indiana as a whole, the Purdies are out and there they reached the semi-final.

Anderson, Frankfort, Rochester and Jefferson of Lafayette stand out as the strongest teams in this section, and should go through with little or no trouble.

The Anderson five seems to have struck its stride again after a slump which threatened to bring the life out of the team. Coach Stagg's five has Marion to meet in its game at Lafayette. Frankfort, after downing the Lebanon team in the semi-final, is set as a strong contender for State honors.

Huntington, Pineville in the regional, Huntington should beat Kendallville. Jefferson appears to be a sure winner. Marion, Angola and Waukon will have a hard-nail battle. Rochester will likely face little opposition against Whiting.

South Bend is expected better than Angola, while Marion can be sure about the Crawfordsville-Syracuse contest.

Unless some unforeseen things, such as the overrunning of the home basket come about, Franklin, Anderson, Frankfort, Rochester, Martinsville, Huntington, and Technical should be strong contenders in this list, but advance reports do not indicate the above eight teams as a possible winner.

Two weeks more and the State will be landing another State high school champion. Who will it be?
