

WELFARE MEET HERE MAR. 31

300 Will Attend Salvation Army Convention.

Business and professional men and women of Indiana, who have been impressed with the practicability of the Salvation Army's county advisory board plan, are coming to Indianapolis, 290 strong, from all parts of the State Thursday, March 31.

They will be delegates from their county advisory boards to the State-wide convention of these boards, which will be held on that day in the Hotel Severin in this city. Secretary of State Ed Jackson, president of the State advisory board, which leads the ninety-two county advisory boards, will preside during the day's session.

The convention will disclose for the first time the extent of one of the most comprehensive social surveys ever made in Indiana or elsewhere.

These surveys have been made in a confidential manner by each county advisory board. The results will be discussed at the State meeting and a definite working plan evolved for meeting the needs.

OUR 'REVENOO' MAN'S SMILIN'

Income Tax Collections Exceed Fondest Hopes.

William L. Elder, collector of internal revenue, is wearing the smile that won't come off today, and all because the late returns from his department show that the amount of money collected for income taxes to date is far greater than even the most optimistic "dooster" in the office had dared to figure.

It had been estimated that the figures for 1920 would exceed this year's receipts by not less than one million dollars, and possibly another half million dollars more, but as a matter of fact, complete figures up to and including March 23 show that \$12,181,109.97 has been collected this year, as against \$12,907,052.73 for a similar period of 1920, leaving a deficit of only \$325,942.76 for this year.

Mr. Elder says that when general

financial conditions are taken into consideration and it is remembered that many individuals and firms who, in the "flush" days of 1920 paid their income tax in one lump sum, are now taking advantage of the quarterly payment plan, it becomes evident that the showing of the department in 1921 has been, little short of remarkable.
