HERE MAR. 31
300 Will Attend Salvation Army Convention.

Businesses and professional men and women of Indiana, who have been impressed with the practicability of the Salvation Army's county advisory board plan, are coming to Indianapolis, 300 strong, from all parts of the State Thursday, March 31. Delegates from their county advisory boards to the State-wide convention of these boards, which will be held on that day in the Hotel Severin in this city. Secretary of State Ed Jackson, president of the State advisory board, and members of the ninety-two county advisory boards will preside during the day's session.

The convention will disclose for the first time the extent of one of the most comprehensive social surveys ever made in Indiana or elsewhere.

Survey work has been made in a confidential manner by each county advisory board. The results will be discussed at the State meeting and a definite working plan evolved for meeting the needs.


