## U. S. OFFENSIVE FOR FAR EAST TRADE LOOMS

Slated as Major Movement in Shifting Ocean Trade Routes.

## PLAN TO OFFSET LOSSES

WASHINGTON, April 4.—An American commercial offensive in the Far East probably will be the major movement in an impending world shifting of ocean trade routes. It was learned today.

The objective of the Far East offensive, if it is undertaken, will be the upbuilding of a trans-Pacific trade to offset losses in Europe and South America and a slump that without new outlets for American productivity, might affect every agricultural and manufacturing industry. This program will include:

Establishment of new steamship lines at San Francisco, Portland, Seattle and all the West coast and Pacific coast ports, together with development of new industries and placing of new manufacturing industries throughout the coast country.

The same development at New Orleans, Galveston and Gulf and South Atlantic ports for new lines to the Far East through the Panama Canal.

New lines and increases in existing services from Boston, New York, Baltimore and other Atlantic ports for trans-Pacific trade via the canal.

Campaigns to induce heavy American investments in railroad building and industrial development in China; investments in Japan, the Straits Settlements, Australia, government and private interest cooperation in building of the Suez Canal and Hong Kong are to British foreign trade; great industrial investment in Siberia as soon as political conditions permit.

All these involve a careful program of commercial diplomacy with Japan, it was said here, and make our Japanese relations of vital bearing to the industrial development of this country.
