### 'NIGHT RIDERS' MISTAKEN FOR BANDITS SQUAD

Frightened Men Tear Wheel From 'Auto in Effort to Avoid Hold-up.'

Robbers apparently were content to sit by their firesides last night as the police reports today showed the dark hours have been without untoward incident beyond an automobile smash resulting from a driver mistaking one of the night riders for a hold-up gang.

Confessions from two "small fry" of the gang held here now are said to show that "customers" of the band were promised any manufacture of automobile they desired within two days from the time the order was placed, or \$100.

One man was arrested on a charge of being a member of the gang, and his uncle, Robert De Jarnett, 42, a former policeman, is said to have made a "clean breast" to local police and representatives of the secretary of State who administers the automobile law.

The men, the report said, were operating in the vicinity of Sergeant Dean's and Watson's, 241 North Tacoma avenue, waiting for a catch when he found the rear door of a downtown furniture store open, but investigation disclosed no one in the store and nothing missing.
