

BURGLARS TAKE SMALL CHANGE; BILLS SAVED

L. W. Morrison Held Up, but Gets Off Lucky—Numerous Thefts.

Hold-up men overlooked a billfold containing a large amount of money when they held up L. W. Morrison, apartment 24, 1220 Park avenue, on Twelfth street between Central and Park avenues early today. However, they took his watch and some small change.
