

CITY LIBRARY MAKES APPEAL TO ALL CLASSES

Latest Book Selections Are
Helpful to Technical
Students.

With help of advice and suggestions from members of the Science Club and other similar organizations in the city a good working collection of books, both for reference purposes and for circulation, is being rapidly built up by the technical department of the public library. A glance over the newer reference books added to the department recently will illustrate how wide an appeal is being made to all classes of workers in the city.

WORKS ON CHEMISTRY.

In the field of chemistry alone the department is rapidly growing. The new and enlarged edition of Thorpe's Dictionary of Applied Chemistry is being added to the library as fast as the volumes are published. A new edition of this well-known work is an event of first importance, for no other work in English has ever approached it for thorough, accurate and comprehensive information on industrial chemistry. The work is being carefully revised and many new articles are being included covering recent developments in the field of technical chemistry.

The fourth and new edition of Beilstein's Handbuch der organischen Chemie is also being added to the department. This is the famous German work on organic chemistry and is perhaps still the best authority in that field. The new edition, coming out one volume at a time since 1913, incorporates much of the recent advance in chemistry brought about by the war.

ELECTRICIANS AND MECHANICS.

The electrician will be interested in the first annual edition of the E. M. F. Electrical Yearbook. This new work is designed as a "book of current information about the electrical industry as a whole and each of its branches, its

service or products and their producers, its terminology, and other frequently sought facts and data not hitherto readily available." It includes definitions of electrical words and abbreviations, and a classification of about 8,000 electrical and other closely related products made and used by the electrical industry.

The new and seventeenth edition of Kildner's architects' and builders' handbook has just been received and will undoubtedly be in great demand by those architects, builders and contractors who are already familiar with the thoroughness and reliability of this standard authority.

For the machinist and mechanical engineer the machinist's encyclopedia is a new work of high excellence which will take its place among the indispensable tools in any good library. It covers practical mathematics and mechanics, machine design, construction and operation, electrical, gas, hydraulic and steam power machinery, metallurgy and concise historical information concerning the development of machine parts and design.

Compiled and edited by the well known authorities, Erik Oberg and Franklin D. Jones, it is a mine of reliable information.

Industrial Oil Engineering by Battle is another reference work of excellent value to the mechanical engineer as well as to mill and power superintendents.

GERMAN TRADE RULE ONE-WAY

Supreme Court Believes Seller
Should Have Advantage.

BERLIN, March 10.—The Federal Supreme Court has pronounced a decision of great importance to American purchasers of German products. It ruled a buyer under a contract containing the now customary "freightland" or undated price clause, is compelled to accept payment where the seller raised the price after the contract was signed. The German courts hitherto have held

the seller was privileged to raise the price a reasonable amount above the contract figure to cover increased cost of manufacture, fluctuations of exchange, etc., but the purchaser is not bound to accept the goods at the new price.

Now the option is made entirely one-sided and the foreign buyer, particularly one who made a deposit, is left entirely at the seller's mercy, except insofar as he is able to go to court and prove the price increase is unreasonable. The court generally suggests the buyer can protect himself by passing the raise along to the next customer, or if the latter has a contract, by making the same also "freightland." Since the American practice does not recognize the elastic German interpretation of contractual relations, this remedy is barred to American importers of German commodities. NEW YORK, March 10.—The silent ballyhoo men of Wall street's bucket shops have mysteriously disappeared.

For months these men, suave, well dressed and of good manners, have haunted the lobbies of some of the most important hotels, meeting men from out of town, who were persuaded that "now's the time" to take a flyer in Wall street.

In various ways the ballyhoos ascertained the financial ratings of visitors and other information that led to the establishment of a firm acquaintanceship. From that point it was easy to lead them into bucket shops operating in "the Street."

Then the fleeing began and continued to such an extent that within the last two months alone \$25,000,000 was taken from the unwary.

Three detective squads that made the rounds recently said that the newspaper exposures had driven every silent ballyhoo a way.
