

CROP REPORT WILL COVER WIDE RANGE

Bureau Will Issue Bulletins
on Farm Con-
ditions.

WASHINGTON, April 28.—During the remainder of the year 1922 the Bureau of Markets and Crop Estimates will issue, under the direction of Agriculture Secretary, on the dates specified, reports covering the acreage, condition, yield, farm receipts and quality of products grown within the United States. The dates are as follows:

MOTHER OF 8 LEAVES HOME FOR NEW LOVE

NEW YORK, April 28.—What Justice Gannon termed "one of the most unusual and unusual cases" of the eternal domestic triangle was brought into the Supreme Court in Brooklyn. It was a suit for divorce brought by Charles J. Cornell, wealthy building contractor, against his wife, the mother of his eight children, whom he charges with having bought a farm at New Woodstock, N. Y., and gone, with three favorites among her children, to live with a man named Herbert Johnson.
The argument of the action was interrupted by the justice after the husband, a son and the son's bride had testified against Mrs. Annie M. Cornell. The case went over indefinitely, the judge insisting upon Mrs. Cornell being produced in court.
The son, Arthur Cornell, and his bride testified to having been invited to Mrs. Cornell's farm shortly after their marriage. They remained until Thanksgiving day, when the bride insisted upon leaving because of the alleged relations of Mrs. Cornell and Johnson. The son said he told his mother she must choose between him and Johnson, and she chose Johnson. Mrs. Arthur Cornell testified her mother-in-law told her she loved Johnson and "nothing else mattered."

JAIL WHIPPING AND SUPPORT FOR FAMILIES

Wives Would Be Required to
Accept Same Status
as Men.

ANNAPOLIS, Md., April 28.—Time-honored prerogatives enjoyed by women are menaced in a bill introduced in the Legislature by Senator Benjamin W. Fox. There shall be in the future "no laws passed giving any rights, benefits or preference to women that are not guaranteed to members of the opposite sex," the measure decrees.
One article, which might be aimed at the widely custom of raiding husband's trouser pockets, provides that the wife who takes her husband's money may be held for embezzlement or larceny.
The bill also provides that:
It shall be the duty of the wife to contribute at least one-half to the expenses of the home and the support of the family.
During pendency of divorce actions, where it is shown the husband is dependent upon the wife for support, she must pay for the maintenance of husband and children.
