State Forester to Make Tour
to Classify Idle
Acres.

Charles C. Deam, State forester under the State department of conservation, today started to inspect woodlands of Indiana, owners of which have petitioned for classification as forest land.

For the purpose of encouraging private forestry in order to put Hoosier idle acres to work, and to prevent as far as possible the further clearing of the remnants of the State's forests, the last Legislature passed a law enabling owners of native or planted forests to classify same as forest land and have it assessed at \$1 per acre. Mr. Deam says hundreds of landowners in all parts of Indiana have written him to inspect their tracts, and by fall he expects to have visited practically each of the ninety-two counties of the State. The results, he believes, will be thousands of acres of small timber tracts which owners otherwise would have cleared will now be left to timber growing.

According to Deam, Hoosiers do not appreciate the need of forests, because until in recent years the State abounded in magnificent forests. In prairie countries millions of dollars are now being spent in order to produce a certain amount of timber. In other countries, he points out, much money is spent annually to reforest. RESERVATIONS FOR OUTING AT INDIANA DUNES

Summer Camp and School of
Instruction on Sand Dunes
Arouse Interest.

Many persons interested in preserving a part of the dunes in northern Indiana for a public park, have made reservations at the Dunes summer camp, promoted by the Dunes Park committee of the Indiana Federation of Clubs, State department of conservation officials, who are cooperating, said today.

The Dunes summer camp will be held June 15-20, near Tremont, Porter County, on the shore of Lake Michigan. Tremont (Three Mountains) is in the heart of the dune country of Indiana, an area famed to scientists and nature lovers over the world, because they declare, Indiana here possesses the finest range of wooded dunes known to man, an area so unique in its formation that it is a marvel to the geographer.

"The dunes possess such a wide range of plant life that this section is a treasurehouse to the botanist. The landscape is so varied and beautiful that artists are

inspired. The beach facilities are no where excelled," State officials say. At the nature school, in connection with the camp, talks on the unique features of the dune country will be given daily by leading scientists of Indiana and Chicago. This program, the committee says, is under the direction of Dr. Henry C. Cowles of Chicago University, one of the fore-

most scientists in the United States, and a student of the dune country for twenty years. Associated with Dr. Cowles are Prof. Stanley Coulter of Purdue University and Prof. George D. Fuller of Chicago University. The instruction is intended to familiarize students with the formation and geography of the dunes, its plant life, its birth and animal life,

its history, its artistic value and its desirability as an Indiana State park, it is announced. A daily "hike" will be conducted by expert guides. The first course begins June 16, and the second on June 23.

"Patrons of the camp may use the beach house and summer camps of the Frazer Club of Chicago, and several cot-

ages are provided for necessary comfort. Meals must either be self-prepared or taken at 'Fish Johnson's. Special prices are to prevail. A nearby store will provide staple groceries, milk, ice, etc.," says a recent bulletin.
